The Brunswick County Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting on 8/6/2018, beginning at 3:00 pm in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the David R. Sandifer Building in the County Government Center in Bolivia. Commissioners present: Randy Thompson, Martin Cooke, Pat Sykes, Mike Forte, Absent: Frank Williams. Staff present included the County Manager, Ann Hardy. An <u>agenda</u> was posted prior to the meeting. The Wilmington Star News & Brunswick Beacon reporters were present.

Agenda discussion topics

- There were no public comments
- Town Administrator Albert Hughes was honored by the Commission for his retirement & years of service
- Building Inspector presented case to hire two more full time inspectors approved. Fees pay for these positions.
- Lockwood Folly Dredging project report Oak Island participating in costs and will receive sand.
 Approved
- County Logo report tabled for further study into its usage vs. county seal
- Surplus parcel sales 3 sites listed approved. Staff directed to study qualifiers before placing properties for sale especially at a loss to the county
- Board appointment Doug Terhume reappointed to Brunswick Community College board of trustees Approved; several other Board seats remain vacant. There are no Physicians who have applied for the Board seat for the Health dept.
- Settlements two back taxes cases were settled. Some property owners received refund due to declining property value in 2007 – total is \$12.5K. Coastal Corporations received a \$145K credit towards tax still owed.
- Code Administration- 5 suggestions will be sent to the NC State Legislature for improving the Code:
- 1) Improve funding & support of drug treatment and drug courts
- 2) Disallow lawsuits between Boards, as has happened with the School Board vs. Commisioners
- 3) Funding & support for School Resource Officers
- 4) Lottery fund distribution should be distributed as advertised
- 5) Disallow unfunded mandates from State to County.
