2014 Annual Meeting Highlights

LWVLCF held its Annual Meeting on June 9, 2014 to adopt a Program for 2014-2015, adopt a budget for the same period, elect new officers and board members, and to share our thoughts, concerns and hopes for League with one another. Several specific matters were brought to the board's attention during the section of the meeting allocated to Direction to the Board; the board appreciated these comments and suggestions and will be addressing them in the coming months.

The Program for 2014-15 is broad and aspirational, encouraging citizen participation in all levels of government, openness in the conduct of government business, and appropriate action as necessary in the areas of immigration, civil rights, voters' rights and the environment. One needs only to glance at the news to know that we have our work cut out for us.

The budget for 2014-15 projects just under \$3700 in revenue, matched by the same approximate amount in expenses. Our largest single expense is for dues to LWVUS and LWVNC, also known as PMP (per member payment). At present, we send \$30 to LWVUS and \$12 to LWVNC for each individual

membership of \$52, leaving \$10 for LWVLCF.

The 2014-15 Officers of LWVLCF are: Chris Abrons, president; Jana Albritton, first vice-president; Loraine Buker, second vice-president; Stephanna Tewey, treasurer; Sheila Fellerath, secretary. Board members are Gail Bromley, Meredith Glicksman, Laura Glover and Myrna Wexler. Gail and Meredith are new to the board and you will find a short introduction to them elsewhere in this newsletter. Loraine served as a board member in 2013-14 and has now assumed an officer's role with particular responsibility for membership; fortunately for us, she is a talented veteran of the membership committee.

It was clear from the conversation and discussion at the Annual Meeting that we have an engaged, energized and growing membership. We're building on the achievements of 40 years, an anniversary we recently celebrated. It promises to be a great year for our League!
